APPENDIX B Acronyms and Defined Terms

ACT: assertive community treatment is one of the nine (9) mental health rehabilitation services provided by the DC CSA.

Anasazi: the DC CSA's practice management system and electronic medical records system. It collects data regarding the consumers receiving services from the DC CSA.

Authority or Mental Health Authority: the organizational component of DMH responsible for exercising regulatory oversight and monitoring of mental health services and supports.

Budget Support Act: the Fiscal Year 2009 Budget Support Act of 2008.

Comprehensive Psychiatric Emergency Program or CPEP: a program operated by DMH that provides psychiatric evaluation, treatment and stabilization, and observation for individuals 18 years of age and older who are experiencing a psychiatric crisis. Services can be accessed by telephone or in person and are available twenty-four hours per day/seven days per week.

Court Ordered Plan: The plan developed by the *Dixon* transitional receiver in 2001, which outlines the steps for returning oversight of the public mental health system to the District.

DC CSA: the organizational component of DMH that delivers community-based services to people with mental illness. Also referred to as the District of Columbia Community Services Agency.

D.C. Healthcare Alliance: the District's health insurance program for uninsured residents who are ineligible for Medicaid.

Dixon or *Dixon* Case: the federal lawsuit regarding community-based services for people with mental illness.

Dixon test: the three-part test described in the Court Ordered Plan for determining the need for government operated mental health services.

eCura: DMH's operating platform, used to process claims for payment for mental health services rendered by contracted providers and the DC CSA.

Free Standing Mental Health Clinics (FSMHCs): clinics that offer Medicaid-funded officebased mental health services including medication management and therapy in accordance with the District of Columbia State Medicaid Plan.

Implementation Plan: the plan required by the Budget Support Act that describes how DMH will implement the recommendations for governance of the DC CSA that are described in this report.

Mental Health Authority: the organizational component of DMH responsible for exercising regulatory oversight and monitoring of mental health services and supports.

Mental Health Rehabilitation Services or MHRS: mental health rehabilitative or palliative services provided by a DMH-certified community mental health provider to consumers in accordance with the District of Columbia State Medicaid Plan. There are nine services available under this program.

Outpatient Competency Restoration Program: a program operated by the DC CSA that provides competency assessments and provides therapeutic support to restore competency for persons referred by the Superior Court.

Psycho-educational Program: The Psycho-Educational team provides mental health services to children and youth enrolled (up to 120) in the District of Columbia Public Schools (DCPS) Psycho-Educational program. DCPS and DMH work collaboratively to provide a comprehensive education and mental health treatment program. The program is designed to promote growth in the emotional, behavioral and academic areas.

Residents Clinic: a clinic staffed by third year psychiatry residents from the Saint Elizabeths Hospital

RFP: Request for Proposals.

Saint Elizabeths Hospital: the state psychiatric hospital for the District of Columbia, operated by DMH.
