

The Clay Terrace Family Success Center is a place for families in Ward 7 to find resources and services to help them thrive, especially in this challenging time. The Center builds on Sasha Bruce Youthwork's commitment to prevent youth homelessness and provide people with the means to find safe homes, achieve and maintain good physical and mental health, and create and strengthen supportive and stable families.

WHAT IS THE FAMILY SUCCESS CENTER?

The Clay Terrace Center is run by Sasha Bruce Youthwork, part of a network of ten success centers located in neighborhoods across Wards 7 and 8 and operated by organizations that our communities know and trust.

Each center in our network is a bit different based on where it's located and who runs it. Our Center is staffed by people who know and love the neighborhood residents in and around Clay Terrace and who are ready to serve anyone from across the city who comes through our doors.

WHY SHOULD I CONNECT WITH THE CENTER?

The Clay Terrace Center will help you access the resources you and your family need. By connecting with the Center, you will find:

- Quick and flexible services and referrals.
- Connections to resources like housing, employment training and placement, healthcare, education, and more.
- Learning opportunities to strengthen parenting skills, find new mentors, increase positive interactions between parents, guardians, and children, and socialize with other families.
- Programming to improve emotional wellness and address mental health needs.
- Opportunities for youth to access tutoring, recreation, employment, and much more.
