



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



1. Admissions to SEH





2. Discharges from SEH





3. Average Daily Census





5. 30-Day Readmission Rate







7. Unusual Incidents by Severity




8. Patient-Involved Unusual Incidents





10. Physical Assaults by Severity





11. Patient Injuries





12. Staff Injuries








