

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

#### 1. Admissions to SEH





# 2. Discharges from SEH





# 3. Average Daily Census











## 7. Unusual Incidents by Severity




#### 8. Patient-Involved Unusual Incidents





# 10. Physical Assaults by Severity












#### 16. Percent of Missing Documentation on Med-Administration


